

Seven ships leave Ukrainian ports on Thursday...

Seven ships carrying agricultural products left Ukrainian Black Sea ports on Thursday November 3rd, the day after Russia resumed its participation in the Black Sea corridor initiative, according to the Ukrainian infrastructure ministry.

The vessels were loaded with 290,000 tonnes of food products and were headed towards European and Asian countries, the ministry said in a statement, without adding further details.

Meanwhile, the Russian delegation resumed work at the Joint Coordination Centre (JCC) that runs the Black Sea grain deal operations in Istanbul. It joined vessel inspections on Thursday, according to the UN Secretariat at the JCC.

It said the queue for inspections has been significantly reduced, with there currently being over 120 ships waiting to move, mainly those planning an inbound voyage.
